Course Information Brochure (Sound Production stream)

Description of Course



Recording and mixing live sound are the major focus areas of the course. Students are given multiple opportunities to set up and operate live audio for concerts and other events. Multiple digital audio workstations are available for students to develop skills in recording programs. Students gain skills required to work creatively and effectively in the music industry. This course has a scored assessment for ATAR purposes at units 3 & 4 level.

Activities/tasks

Students complete a broad range of activities including but not limited to:

- Setting up and operating live sound equipment and mixing for events such as the annual music festival and school musical
- Setting up, recording and mixing music in an industry standard recording studio
- Recording, mixing, mastering and producing for a range of bands and artists
- Installing and programming of lighting systems
- Investigating methods and techniques used in recording bands and artists
- Planning, preparing and promoting music and other events

<u>Assessment</u>

Units of competency are assessed using a variety of methods including practical observation, written and research tasks and case studies.

Students will be given a fair and adequate assessment process that includes multiple opportunities to demonstrate competency.

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Benefits of this training

Students gain a broad basis of industry knowledge and skills that can be applied in multiple life and work experiences. The course builds pathways into further study embracing students' passion for music and audio.

Further Education Pathways

Students can study a Certificate IV in Music Industry in a Sound Production stream at the college. Diplomas in Music Industry with Sound Production, Music Business or higher education at university are options.

<u>Pathways</u>

Sound engineering in recording studios, radio, film/TV, advertising, sound design, producing, live sound, musical theatre, stage productions, stage management, festival or touring management, music teaching, DJ/ MCing, composing and performance.

Length of the Course

This program runs for one half day per week over two years. Students are provided with a schedule and training plan for completing assessment tasks for each unit.

Enrolment Process

All students must attend a fifteen-minute interview.

<u>External students must</u>

- 1. Complete an Application Form given from home school for approval at the home school level.

Internal Students must make an application online and attend an interview and an audition.
