NCAT Music students, Monique and Bianca Hirschfeld, who excelled in the VCAA Top Acts, were commissioned to provide musical entertainment for the event.



PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Term 2 Ends

This has been an incredibly busy and challenging term for students, teachers and parents/carers.

The term started well, with students focused, and more settled. We organised for the school formal to be early in the year to avoid COVID lockdowns and, thank goodness. it was able to go ahead as planned. It was attended by almost half the Year 10-12 student cohort and was a great night. Students and staff got up to dance and had fun. The formal is always one of the year's highlight and having it earlier brought students together more. The Year 12 Theatre Studies students were able to perform their play, "Tracks", to a live audience which added to the excitement for students and audience alike.

Information Evening on 18th May

The event was a great success. It was well attended with the auditorium full. Our student leaders and helpers were absolutely outstanding and great ambassadors for the college.





In a couple of areas, where teachers were unable to attend, the students took charge, informing tour groups about the programs. Our student speakers: Grace Davidson from 10 Arts, Mitchell Seath from Pre-App and Josh Guest from VCE were superb. I had several parents comment to me that they actually got tears in their eyes listening to them. They and parent, Andrew Butler, whose son Jack, is in Year 12, spoke with passion and from the heart about NCAT and its staff. Thank you to everyone involved for your terrific contribution to making the evening such a great success.

COVID hits - again

Unfortunately, students and staff had to pivot back to remote learning which works well for some students and not so well for others. We were delighted to have Year 11 and 12 back after one week and all students back after two weeks. The new restrictions meant that we were required to cancel Year 10 work experience and postpone Preapp and VCAL work placements. At this stage we will reschedule the Structured Work Placements to October as these count as one unit and form part of a students' VCAL credits. Excursions and incursions were deferred to next term including the VET Taster day for external students when hundreds of students from other schools come to try our VET programs. This will now run on the 16 July.

Music Performances Streamed

Because of COVID restrictions many of the Music performances planned for the end of Term will now be recorded and streamed.

Attendance and Explanations for Absences


Year 10 Science

We are excited to see the students continue to work together and to view their final products.








